SkyGolf Handheld Rangefinder First to Gain Approval

In an unprecedented decision, SkyGolf's SG2 rangefinder has been approved for competitive use by the Adams Golf Tight Lies Tour. "The Tight Lies Tour is excited to have SkyGolf as the only approved yardage measuring device for use during competition for our events. This new technology is the future of golf and we have no doubt that SkyGolf will be an asset for the Tour and our Touring professionals." said the Tour's Gary DeSerrano. "This landmark agreement represents the first time in the history of professional golf that an electronic yardage device has been approved for use during tournament competition," said Richard Edmonson, CEO of SkyHawke Technologies, developer of SkyGolf. "The decision to use SkyGolf in professional competition validates our claim that the SG2 gives golfers of all skill levels instant access to the information they need to play their best golf."

The use of an electronic yardage-measuring device is perfectly legal for establishing and maintaining a USGA handicap. In *Golfweek* (6/28/03) USGA executive director David Fay says, "In the 21st century, it seems silly to make the distinction that you cannot obtain distances from an electronic device but you can obtain distances from sprinkler heads and from yardage books, and, when you get there, you have to do a little pacing, and it slows down play." The SkyGolf SG2 has been selected by the PGA Learning Center to be showcased at their facility in Port St. Lucie, Florida.

SkyGolf answers the first question every golfer asks when they arrive at their ball, "How far?" The first handheld GPS system ever designed exclusively for the individual golfer, SkyGolf's SG2 gives real time yardages to all critical targets on the golf course.
